

Private Party FAQs

Frequently Asked Questions of customers booking
a Private Sunday Party

What does my booking include?

Your booking includes private access to Hullabaloo soft play and our Cafe + Bar seating area in the main church space for two hours.

How much is a private party?

Our Private Parties are a set fee of £600

Can I have my party in the morning?

We don't offer Sunday mornings as the church service is taking place at this time. We offer two afternoon slots:
1.30pm – 3.30pm and 4pm – 6pm.

How many children can I invite?

We have space for 10 Babies and 38 Juniors at any one time.

How many adults can I invite?

With a capacity for 48 little ones, we would expect up to two adults per child. If you are expecting more than 100 adults, please let us know so that we can be prepared.

Can we arrive early to set up the table?

No. We ask that you don't arrive early as the centre will either be in use by the church or busy with an earlier booking. Please only arrive 15 minutes before your booking.

Can we rearrange the tables?

No. Please refrain from rearranging the furniture when you are here.

Can I bring my own food?

You are welcome to bring your own food and birthday cake however we do ask that you assist our staff team in clearing up any mess before you leave.

Can I bring my own drinks?

No, we do not allow customers to bring their own drinks.

Please purchase all drinks at the Sanctuary Cafe + Bar.

We have a selection of hot and cold drinks, decaf teas and coffees, alcohol and children's fruit juice and milkshake cartons.

Do you provide plates?

We do not offer anything for food that you bring in yourself, so please bring everything with you including napkins and paper plates if needed for a party.

Can I arrange an entertainer?

Yes. Please let us know if you are planning to bring an entertainer or face painter. Please note however we do not allow glitter or confetti.

Can I decorate the space?

Yes. However, we think the space looks beautiful as it is! Remember you only have two hours so recommend balloons and tablecloths rather than large complex displays.
